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## **2017 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS**

The aims of the championships are to give every club member the opportunity to compete for an award, regardless of whether they are a competitor, a marshal or a social member and to encourage involvement in the club activities.

We welcome once again sponsorship for this year's marshal's championship from Coronado Controls who have donated £500. This is in addition to the £500 that is allocated by the club to the all-rounders championship.

Any club member winning an award in the ANCC, ANWCC, EMAMC, SD34 championships or any other approved by the committee will receive free club membership for the following year (or a reduction of £10 from a family membership).

## GENERAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

1. These general rules apply to **all** the championships
2. All the Championships will run from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017
3. The Championships are open to all fully paid up members of the club. Registration will not be required.
4. To claim points, competitors must enter events under Bolton-le-Moors Car Club (as their first named club) and where event regulations allow, cars must display current Club Logo's on either side of their car.
5. **All points must be claimed by providing the relevant Championship Coordinator with a copy of the final entry list and set of final results for the event within two months of the event** . Where the coordinator obtains the results from another source e.g. Internet then he will award points to all BLMCC members starting the event. However it is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that points are awarded for each event they enter. **No points will be given after the two month cut off.**
6. Where 4 or more entrants who are BLMCC members start an event of Clubman status or higher a 'Best Bolton' award will be made to the highest placed competitor in the overall classification.
7. In the event of classes being amalgamated you may claim points for your original class. It is your responsibility to inform the championship coordinator if this applies to your results.
8. Current Championship positions will be published in BLEMAG, on the Club website, and emailed round.

# ALL ROUNDERS CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

1. All events of Clubsport or higher status in the following categories will be included in the Championship:
  - a. Autosolo
  - b. Autotest (including PCA's)
  - c. PCT
  - d. Hillclimb
  - e. Race
  - f. Rallycross
  - g. Sprint
  - h. Road Rally
  - i. Stage Rally

2. Points will be awarded for each event in categories a to i based on class positions using the following formula:

$$\frac{(\text{Number of starters in class} + 1) - \text{Class Position} \times 100}{\text{Number of starters in class}}$$

In the event of there being less than three starters in a class then 75% of the points calculated above will be scored. If the class has been amalgamated on the event then your points will be awarded from whichever class gives you the highest points

3. Additional points will be awarded to each competitor who starts an event depending on status - 10 for Clubmans, 20 for Nat B and 40 for Nat A.
4. Competitors will be able to count a maximum of 14 scores, with a maximum of 6 scores in one category, and a maximum of 4 scores in any other category.
5. To qualify for the all rounders championship competitors must compete in a minimum of two different categories
6. Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the Champion and Runner Up.
7. The cash prize fund (rounded to the nearest pound) will be divided amongst all members who qualify for points in this championship and score a minimum of 120 points for marshalling on at least one club event, or club arranged marshalling trip.
8. Ties will be resolved in favour of the competitor claiming points in the largest number of categories. Any further tie will be resolved in favour of the competitor with the highest claimed first score.

# OFF THE ROAD, SPEED, ROAD RALLY & STAGE

## RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

1. Where 3 or more competitors enter 3 or more events in the same group of categories then they will qualify for a championship for that group as follows
2. Off Road Champion – Categories a,b,&c
3. Speed Champion – Categories d,e,f & g
4. Road Rally Driver & Co-Driver Champion Category h.
5. Stage Rally Driver & Co - Driver Champion Category i.
6. Points will be awarded in the same way as for the All Rounders Championship, with exception to category H which will include class position and overall position.(Class plus overall divided by two)
7. Competitors will be able to count a maximum of 8 scores in any one group.
8. Points cannot be claimed for Trophy or practice events that are run for retirees from events.
9. Any competitor who qualifies for a championship, as defined above, and is a named official on an event in the same category they will score the same number of points as a class winner. Competitors may only claim full points as an official on one event in each category and half points (60) for a second event. These points will not be included in the All Rounders Championship.
10. Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the Champion and Runner Up (subject to 5 qualifiers in the group).

# CORONADO CONTROLS MARSHALS CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS

1. Members will be given the opportunity to be involved in every type of marshalling duty.
2. Events with club involvement are events in ANCC, ANWCC, EMAMC and SD34 Championships.
3. Points will be awarded as follows:
  - a. Marshalling (per day) on a club event 120 points
  - b. Marshalling (per 1/2 day) on a club event 60 points
  - c. Marshalling an event with club involvement (1 day) 60 points
  - e. Marshalling an event with club involvement (1/2 day) 30 points
  - f. Marshalling (over 8hrs) on an event 60 extra points
4. There is no limit on the number of events on which points may be claimed.
5. To be eligible for a cash award you must marshal on a minimum of two club events, and score a minimum of 200 points, OR one club event and one club arranged trip with a minimum of 200 points.
6. Full day scoring will be defined by anyone who carries out any duty for over 4 hours in any one day.
7. Half day scoring will be defined by anyone who carries out any duty for up to 4 hours in any one day
8. Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the Champion and Runner Up.
9. A cash prize fund of £500 will be divided amongst all members who qualify for points in this championship (rounded to the nearest pound).

## ***SOCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS***

1. Points will be awarded as follows:
  - a. Participating in competitive social evening - 100 points for 1st O/A down to 10point for 10th O/A plus 10 points for participating
  - b. Organising a social evening – 110 points
  - c. Writing an article for BLEMAG – 110 points
  - d. Introducing a new member - 110 points
2. Anyone organising and competing on a social event may only claim one set of points.

1. Members will be given the opportunity to be involved in organising events. This includes every aspect of organisation from being Clerk of Course to helping with setting up.
2. Points will be awarded as follows:

a. Clerk of the Course (Rally)	120 points
b. Clerk of the Course (Autotest/AutoSolo/PCA)	90 points
c. Secretary of Meeting (Rally)	90 points
e. Secretary of Meeting (Autotest/AutoSolo/PCA)	70 points
f. Named Official	60 points
G. Setting up / Tidying Up	120 points
H. Other work associated with running of event	50 points
3. There is no limit on the number of events on which points may be claimed.
4. Awards will be presented at the annual awards evening to the Champion and Runner Up.
